

JUDGE ELIZABETH GOBEIL - GEORGIA COURT OF APPEALS (R)

Key findings include:

- **Republican-Appointed, Conservative Appellate Judge With Federalist Society Roots:** Judge Elizabeth Dallas Gobeil is a Republican-appointed Georgia Court of Appeals judge with longstanding ties to the conservative legal movement. A graduate of Emory University and the University of Georgia School of Law, she worked early in her career for the Federalist Society and as a legislative aide to U.S. Senator Paul Coverdell. She was appointed by Republican Governor Nathan Deal to the State Board of Workers' Compensation in 2012 and to the Georgia Court of Appeals in 2018. She ran unopposed in 2020 and has not faced a competitive statewide election.
- **Experienced Fundraiser:** Gobeil has proven herself to be a strong fundraiser, with \$392,554.57 ending monetary balance as of January 2026 reporting. She has received 682 total campaign contributions since her first campaign filing in 2019 with \$472,975.15 total raised.
- **Embedded in Georgia's Republican Governing Network:** Gobeil and her husband, Bart Gobeil, have both long been involved with Republican political networks. They are both graduates of Leadership Georgia (Class of 2012) and are closely connected to the Deal-era Republican governing structure. Bart Gobeil served as Chief Operating Officer for the State of Georgia under Gov. Deal and previously as chief of staff to Lt. Gov. Casey Cagle. His career spans state government, lobbying, economic development (Georgia Ports Authority), and conservative-aligned public policy consulting. Gobeil and her husband Bart contributed between \$1,000-\$4,999 to the Federalist Society in 2019.
- **Personal Political Contributions:** Gobeil has made contributions U.S. Saxby Chambliss in 2002 (\$250), the RNC in 2008 (\$500), Mitt Romney's presidential campaign in 2007 (\$500), and the McCain-Palin campaign in 2008 (\$500). Gobeil's husband, Bart, has also made contributions to federal candidates and PACs, with a \$5,000 donation to Jim Kingston's congressional campaign in 2025 and \$540 to the Georgia Republican Party in 2003. Kingston posted a photo with Charlie Kirk following the death of Kirk, himself, and others at Mar-a-Lago during Trump's campaign.
- **Corporate and Defense-Bar Professional Background:** Before joining the bench, Gobeil was a partner at Thompson Hine LLP and later served as senior in-house counsel for pharmaceutical companies Solvay and UCB. Her legal background centers on business litigation, regulatory matters, and corporate defense. Thompson Hine has litigated before the Georgia Court of Appeals, including during her tenure, though no direct misconduct allegations have surfaced.
- **Supported by Conservative Legal Movement and Tort-Reform Donors:** Gobeil has received campaign contributions from prominent conservative legal strategist Leonard Leo, the Georgia Lawsuit Reform PAC (aligned with tort reform efforts), business executives, and numerous attorneys from major Georgia law firms. Her donor base heavily skews toward corporate defense firms, regulated industries, banking, insurance, and business interests. She and her husband have also personally contributed to federal Republican candidates and committees.
- **Campaign Infrastructure Connected to Controversial Republican Operatives:** Several vendors used by Gobeil's campaign have ties to nationally controversial Republican figures. RTA Strategies' managing partner served as treasurer for George Santos and has been linked to

Marjorie Taylor Greene and other MAGA-aligned campaigns. Tyson Strategies' principal represented Donald Trump during post-2020 Georgia election disputes. The Stoneridge Group has done work for Heritage Action, which has been associated with hard-right election and governance advocacy. There is no evidence Gobeil personally engaged in election denial activity, but vendor relationships link her campaign operations to politically polarizing networks.

- **Election Administration Rulings Reinforcing Certification Duties:** In a 2025 case involving Fulton County's refusal to certify election results, Gobeil joined an opinion affirming that certification of election results is a mandatory, nondiscretionary duty for local election officials. The ruling rejected arguments that officials could withhold certification while investigating irregularities, reinforcing statutory election-certification requirements amid broader post-2020 election disputes in Georgia.
- **Procedural Revival of 2020 Election-Related Lawsuit:** In a 2023 decision, Gobeil joined a unanimous panel partially reviving a Fulton County vote-dilution lawsuit tied to 2020 election allegations. The ruling did not validate fraud claims but held that certain Fulton County voters could attempt to establish standing under a newly articulated "community stakeholder" doctrine. The decision was procedural and remanded the case for further review.
- **Ruled Against Employee in Pension Dispute:** In a pension dispute involving Hall County employees seeking approximately \$75 million, Gobeil joined the majority ruling against the employees, holding that a pension freeze did not constitute plan termination requiring additional procedural protections.
- **Ruled in Favor of Pharma Company in Wrongful Death Opioid Case:** with In a wrongful-death opioid case against McKesson Corporation, Gobeil joined a unanimous decision dismissing the claim on statute-of-limitations grounds, holding that the two-year personal-injury limit applied. The court did not reach the broader question of distributor liability under Georgia's Drug Dealer Liability Act.
- **Ruled in Favor of Ambulance Chasing:** In a case involving alleged improper attorney solicitation ("ambulance chasing"), Gobeil authored an opinion dismissing claims brought by a competing attorney, reasoning that any harm would fall to accident victims rather than rival lawyers.

The Georgia Court of Appeals is the intermediate appellate court for Georgia and hears most appeals that are not reserved to the Supreme Court of Georgia. The court has 15 judges who sit in five divisions of three judges each (with assignments made/changed pursuant to internal rules and statute) [[Georgia AOC](#), accessed, 2/18/2026].

Georgia's intermediate appellate judges are chosen through statewide, nonpartisan elections at the general primary in even-numbered years, with terms structured on a six-year cycle under state law [[Justia](#), accessed, 2/18/2026]. For the 2026 cycle, the Georgia Secretary of State has published a list of "Judges – Court of Appeals" offices appearing on the ballot in 2026 that includes "Elizabeth Gobeil," with a term end date shown as 12/31/2026 [[Georgia Secretary of State](#), accessed, 2/19/2026].

Demographically and politically, Georgia is a large and fast-growing state whose population is estimated by the U.S. Census Bureau at ~11.3M (July 1, 2025) and ~11.18M (July 1, 2024), with substantial metropolitan concentration and continued growth that has reshaped electoral and civic institutions [[United States Census](#), accessed, 2/19/2026]. The court's statewide jurisdiction means judges campaign (and are evaluated by voters) in a context that includes: (a) a competitive statewide political

environment; (b) intense scrutiny around election rules and election litigation; and (c) high salience of criminal justice, protest-related prosecutions, and separation-of-powers disputes [[Georgia Court of Appeals](#), 12/19/2024].

BACKGROUND

Personal Background

Elizabeth Dallas Gobeil (born Thomaston, GA) earned a B.A. in history from Emory University in 1991 and a J.D. from the University of Georgia in 1995. Early in her career she worked briefly for the Federalist Society in Washington, D.C. and served as a legislative aide to U.S. Senator Paul Coverdell. She later practiced law in Atlanta – first as a partner at Thompson Hine LLP (where she was hiring partner) and then as senior in-house counsel for pharmaceutical companies (Solvay and UCB). In 2012 Governor Deal appointed her to the Georgia State Board of Workers’ Compensation, where she was Director and also served as an appellate judge on the Board [[GA Appeals](#), [Elect Judge Gobeil](#)].

In 2018 Judge Gobeil was appointed to the Georgia Court of Appeals by Gov. Deal to fill the vacancy left by Elizabeth Branch. She was sworn in on June 5, 2018 and ran for re-election in 2020, running unopposed [[Wikipedia](#)].

Gobeil resides in Savannah, GA with her husband, Bart Gobeil, and is active in her community (Isle of Hope Methodist Church, Ronald McDonald House).

Both her and her husband, Bart, are graduates of Leadership Georgia (Class of 2012) [[GA Appeals](#)].

Bart Gobeil

Bart Gobeil is a Georgia public-affairs and government-operations figure based in Savannah/Chatham County. He is a University of Massachusetts Amherst graduate and has held senior roles in Georgia state government, economic development, nonprofit leadership, and consulting.

Bart Gobeil appears to be a Republican based on his service under Republican Gov. Nathan Deal, his earlier role as chief of staff to Republican Lt. Gov. Casey Cagle, and his prior work for Republican Sen. Paul Coverdell. Bart Gobeil also posted a [picture](#) of Ronald Reagan on July 4, 2022 and [another](#) on July 4, 2017.

His resume. [LinkedIn](#) appears to span four main lanes:

1. **Georgia state government:** He served in the Deal administration, first moving over from Lt. Gov. **Casey Cagle’s** office, then becoming **Chief Operating Officer for the State of Georgia**, where official and organizational bios say he oversaw more than 60 agencies/authorities and major statewide operations.
2. **Political/government relations:** Before that, he was **Casey Cagle’s chief of staff**, worked for late U.S. Sen. **Paul Coverdell**, and held government-relations roles including at **AGL Resources** and the **Georgia Public Service Commission**.
3. **Economic development / ports:** After leaving the governor’s office, he joined the **Georgia Ports Authority** in a senior economic-development/government-affairs role. Georgia Conservancy and GPA materials describe him as helping shape regulatory, legislative, and

investment strategy around port-related growth.

4. **Consulting / nonprofit / boards:** He later became president of the **Georgia Conservancy**, then led **Platform Strategies**, described as a business and public-policy consulting firm. He has also held state board and committee appointments, including the **Georgia Lottery Corporation** board and, more recently, Georgia coastal protection committees.

PROFESSIONAL & LEGAL BACKGROUND

Professionally, Judge Gobeil has served on numerous judicial committees. She is on the Court's Executive Committee and the state Judicial Council, and was appointed co-chair of the Judicial Council's Ad-Hoc Committee on Artificial Intelligence (subcommittee for Access to Justice & Community Education). She also sits on the Chief Justice's Commission on Professionalism and the Board of Trustees for the Institute for Continuing Judicial Education [[Elect Judge Gobeil](#)].

Thompson Hine LLP

[Thompson Hine LLP](#) is a U.S. full-service business law firm founded in 1911 with ~400+ lawyers and a multi-office footprint (recently expanding into Los Angeles (2024) and Minneapolis (2025), and reporting continued national growth and an innovation-focused service model branded SmartPaTH). Across the firm, Thompson Hine markets itself as a business-focused platform spanning litigation + corporate + regulatory work. Examples called out in firm and directory profiles include: business litigation / class actions / internal investigations, corporate / M&A / securities, real estate / construction, IP & technology litigation, antitrust.

Thompson Hine LLP has litigated in front of the Georgia Court of Appeals, including in 2020 ([Henry V. Atlanta Gas Light Company](#)), 2019 ([Turfstore.com, Inc. v. Hall](#)) 2018 ([Neff v. McGee](#)), and before.

It does not appear there were other high profile controversies, figures, or cases relating to the firm.

POLITICAL AFFILIATION & ACTIVITY:

Ideology & Politics

Gobeil is a Republican; she was appointed by Republican Governor Nathan Deal to the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation and to the Georgia Court of Appeals.

Affiliation with political figures/organizations:

Gobeil is an active member of the Federalist Society (as of 2019). She is mentioned as being a long-time member of the Atlanta Chapter of the Federalist Society and of the more recent Savannah Chapter. She also worked for the organization before attending law school in the '90s [[Buckhead Rotary Club](#)]. Her and her husband Bart donated between \$1,000-\$4,999 to the organization in 2019 [[Federalist Society](#)].

Gobeil was on the McCain-Palin Georgia Lawyers Coalition [States News Service, 10/2/2008]

Judge Benjamin Land

Gobeil congratulated Ben Land on his appointment to the Georgia Supreme Court [[X](#)].

Benjamin A. Land serves as a justice on the Supreme Court of Georgia. He was appointed in 2025 by Brian Kemp. Before joining the Supreme Court, Land served on the Georgia Court of Appeals, where he participated in civil, criminal, and election-related cases. Earlier in his judicial career, Land was appointed by Nathan Deal to serve as a judge on the Chattahoochee Judicial Circuit Superior Court.

Dissented From Removing Willis From Election-Interference Prosecution: While serving on the Georgia Court of Appeals, Judge Benjamin A. Land dissented from a 2–1 panel decision disqualifying Fulton County District Attorney Fani Willis from prosecuting the Georgia election-interference case. Land argued that the appellate court should defer to the trial court’s findings and that an “appearance of impropriety,” without evidence of an actual conflict of interest or misconduct, was insufficient to remove a prosecutor from the case. - The majority opinion was written by E. Trenton Brown and joined by Todd Markle, who concluded Willis’ relationship with special prosecutor Nathan Wade created an appearance of impropriety requiring disqualification. Land dissented, arguing that appellate courts should defer to the trial court’s findings and that an “appearance of impropriety,” without proof of an actual conflict of interest or misconduct, was insufficient to remove a prosecutor from the case. U.S. Senator Paul Coverdell

1996-1999: Early in her career, Gobeil served as a legislative aide to the U.S. Senator Paul Coverdell (R-GA), working on health care and judiciary policy issues during Coverdell’s tenure in the Senate from 1993–2000. Coverdell’s tenure occurred during a period when the Republican Party was expanding its influence in Georgia politics. He was reelected to the Senate in 1998 and became the first Republican from Georgia since Reconstruction to win reelection to the chamber.

School Choice and Privatization of Education: During his tenure in the U.S. Senate, Paul Coverdell advocated for the creation of tax-advantaged education savings accounts intended to help families pay for education expenses. His proposal established Education Individual Retirement Accounts (Education IRAs), which were enacted as part of the Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997. The accounts allowed families to contribute after-tax dollars to investment accounts where earnings could grow tax-free when used for qualified education expenses. The program was later renamed Coverdell Education Savings Accounts and formed part of broader Republican efforts in the late 1990s to expand education-related tax incentives and promote school-choice-aligned reforms through the federal tax code. Conservative Tax Policy and Opposition to Tax Increases: Coverdell consistently supported Republican tax-cut proposals during the late 1990s and opposed federal tax increases. Senator Paul Coverdell voted in favor of the Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997, a major Republican-backed tax package that reduced the top long-term capital gains tax rate from 28 percent to 20 percent and introduced additional tax incentives tied to savings and investment. at reducing federal taxation and expanding tax-advantaged private savings vehicles. Support for Federal Drug Prevention Initiatives: During his tenure in the Senate, Paul Coverdell voted in favor of the Omnibus Consolidated and Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act, 1999, a bipartisan appropriations package that included provisions establishing the National Youth Anti-Drug Media Campaign. The initiative funded a nationwide public education campaign administered by the Office of National Drug Control Policy aimed at discouraging illegal drug use among youth. The legislation passed with bipartisan support in both chambers of Congress. [[H.R.4328](#), accessed, 3/6/2026]

Nathan Deal

Nathan Deal, who appointed Gobeil to the Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation and to the Court of Appeals was involved in several controversies and legislated on wedge issues during his time as governor:

- **Ethics investigation into 2010 campaign:** One of the biggest controversies was the long-running ethics investigation into his 2010 gubernatorial campaign. Georgia's ethics commission eventually cleared Deal of the major allegations but found "technical defects" in his campaign and financial disclosures, and he agreed to pay \$3,350 in administrative fees. Reporting at the time said the original allegations included misuse of campaign funds and excessive contributions [[AJC](#)].
- **Georgia Ethics Commission whistleblower:** A related and more politically damaging episode was the whistleblower scandal involving the Georgia ethics commission itself. Former ethics commission director Stacey Kalberman said she was pushed out while aggressively investigating Deal's campaign, and the state later paid \$1.8 million to settle ethics-related cases tied to that broader controversy. Even though that did not establish that Deal personally ordered retaliation, it created a lasting perception problem around whether his administration benefited from pressure on the watchdog [[AJC](#)].
- **Campaign money from state contractors and lobbyists:** Deal and his PACs received campaign money from state contractors and lobbyists. AJC reporting scrutinized how special-interest and contractor money flowed through Georgia politics during the Deal era, including through leadership PAC structures and allied political networks. This was more of an ethics and influence controversy than a single scandal, but it fed a broader narrative that the Deal administration operated within a donor-friendly insider system [[AJC](#)].
- **Charter-School funded lobbyist trip:** Deal also drew criticism for accepting a trip paid for by a lobbyist-backed charter-school group, despite his own executive order restricting most lobbyist gifts. Reporting said he allowed StudentsFirst and related allies to pay for a New Orleans charter-school trip for him and other officials, which critics saw as inconsistent with his public ethics posture [[AJC](#)].
- **Redistricting:** Deal was not especially known for a public redistricting message, but as governor he signed Georgia's 2011 congressional and legislative maps into law after the Republican legislature passed them in special session. Contemporary coverage noted that Democrats argued the maps diluted minority voting strength, while the state defended them and the U.S. Department of Justice later precleared them under the then-applicable Voting Rights Act regime. So the practical takeaway is that Deal backed and enacted the GOP redistricting plan, even if he was not the loudest public face of it [[GPB](#)].
- **20 Week Abortion Ban:** In 2012, Deal signed a law banning most abortions after 20 weeks of pregnancy, placing him firmly in the anti-abortion camp. That does not mean he took every later step the party wanted — for example, the 2019 six-week "heartbeat" law was signed by Brian Kemp, not Deal — but Deal's own record is plainly anti-abortion.
- **Vetoed Anti-Gay "Religious Freedom" bill:** Deal vetoed HB 757, the so-called religious-liberty bill, saying he would not sign legislation that allowed discrimination and stating he did not believe protecting faith required discriminating against others [[Reuters](#)].

Casey Cagle

Gobeil's husband, Bart Gobeil, worked for former Lieutenant Governor Casey Cagle. Cagle was involved in several controversies during his tenure:

- **Affair and ethics complaint:** In the closing days of the 2010 election, an ethics complaint alleged that Cagle had an affair with a staffer and paid her nearly \$200,000 in campaign funds.

Cagle denied the allegations, and the complaint was widely treated as a late campaign attack. I have not seen reporting tying Gobeil to the alleged conduct itself [[AJC](#)].

- **Delta/NRA tax break fight:** While running for governor, Cagle publicly threatened to block tax legislation benefiting Delta after the airline ended a discount program for NRA members. The Senate then removed the jet-fuel tax break from the bill. The episode drew heavy criticism as political retaliation and became one of the defining controversies of his gubernatorial run [[Georgia Public Broadcasting](#)].
- **Broader ethics/corruption-adjacent reporting around Cagle-era alliances:** Reporting around the long-running Nathan Deal / Casey Cagle political network included questions about budget maneuvers and insider influence. One example: a CREW report, citing contemporaneous reporting, noted that Bart Gobeil declined to say whether Cagle asked for money to be restored in the budget in a matter tied to the broader Deal/Cagle network. That does not make Gobeil the subject of the scandal, but it does show him appearing in the record as a protective senior aide during a controversial period [[CREW](#), [AJC](#)].

Partisan posts

No partisan posts found from Gobeil.

Campaign

Gobeil used the following firms for campaign law, fundraising, or digital consulting, all of which had connections to controversies or controversial figures:

Clark Hill PLC:

- **Gobeil used Clark Hill PLC for legal consulting:** Gobeil's June 2025 campaign filing listed \$1,500 paid to Clark Hill PLC for "Legal" [[Georgia Campaign Finance System](#), candidate search].
- **Sued for access to election training materials:** Clark Hill represented the Michigan House of Representatives in the lawsuit seeking access to election training materials and the Bureau of Elections' online learning portal. The complaint lists Clark Hill lawyers as counsel for the House, and AP described the case as part of the House GOP's broader confrontation with Benson over election oversight. House Republicans framed the case as oversight of election integrity, while Benson's office argued some materials were sensitive and implicated election security and cybersecurity concerns [[Gongwer](#)].
- **Represented MI GOP in lawsuit re; voter-approved independent redistricting commission:** Clark Hill represented the Michigan Republican Party and Republican-affiliated individual plaintiffs in the federal challenge to Michigan's voter-approved independent redistricting commission created by Proposal 2 of 2018. The complaint explicitly lists Clark Hill as counsel for the Michigan Republican Party and alleges the ballot proposal improperly displaced party influence over redistricting [[Brennan Center](#)].
- **League of Women Voters v. Johnson / Republican Congressional Delegation intervention (2018–2019):** Clark Hill represented Michigan's Republican congressional delegation as proposed intervenors/defendants in the partisan-gerrymandering litigation over Michigan's old congressional maps. Court filings and appellate papers list Clark Hill as counsel for the Republican congressional delegation, and a later mandamus petition also lists Clark Hill for Republican officeholders including Lee Chatfield and Aaron Miller [[Brennan Center](#)].

RTA Strategy

- **Gobeil used for campaign consulting:** Gobeil’s January 2026 campaign filing listed \$10,800 paid to RTA Strategies for “Other (Campaign finance, Consulting, administration and reporting)” [[Georgia Ethics Commission](#), candidate search].
- **Ties to George Santos:** RTA Strategy was a vendor to George Santos’s campaign, appearing in FEC filings for compliance, treasury, and reporting work, and Santos’s committee later reported a large debt owed to RTA. The firm’s managing partner Jason Boles was also publicly identified in 2023 as Santos’s campaign treasurer [[FEC](#), [AJC](#), [Notus](#), [Rolling Stone](#)].
- **RTA’s managing partner has ties to Santos, MJT, other Republicans:** RTA’s managing partner, Jason Boles, was publicly identified in 2023 as Santos’s campaign treasurer [[FEC](#), [Notus](#)]. It was also reported Boles had worked with Marjorie Taylor Greene [[Newsday](#)] and Herschel Walker [States News Service, 8/26/2021].
- **Ties to RFK Jr. & MAGA:** Separate reporting also tied Boles/RTA to the pro-RFK Jr. super PAC “Heal the Divide,” which Rolling Stone described as having deep ties to MAGA-aligned operatives [[Rolling Stone](#)].

Front Runner LLC

- **Gobeil used for campaign consulting:** Gobeil’s January 2026 campaign filing listed \$40 paid to Front Runner LLC for “Other (Campaign finance, Consulting, administration and reporting)” [[Georgia Ethics Commission](#), candidate search].
- **Connection to George Santos:** FrontRunner appears in FEC filings as a campaign-finance software vendor used by Santos’s campaign and by other Republican candidates [[FEC](#), [Notus](#)].

The Stoneridge Group LLC

- **Gobeil used for website hosting:** Gobeil’s April 2020 campaign filing listed over \$200 collectively paid to The Stoneridge Group LLC for “Campaign Web hosting” [[Georgia Ethics Commission](#), candidate search].
- **Ties to Heritage Foundation/Heritage Action:** FEC records show The Stoneridge Group did work for Heritage Action for America (now called Heritage Action) in 2018 and 2019, a hard-right conservative advocacy group. The Stoneridge Group LLC was paid by Heritage Action for America for “website design” and “mailer design/printing/mailing” connected to its “Tax Cut Champ” [[FEC](#), [FEC](#)].
- **Heritage Foundation’s far right work:** Heritage’s own “[Election Fraud Map](#)” is used to argue that fraud is a meaningful threat in U.S. elections, while mainstream reporting has criticized that effort for overstating isolated cases and feeding broader fraud narratives [[Washington Post](#)]. Separately, AP described the Heritage Foundation’s Project 2025 as a blueprint for a “hard-right turn” in American government and society [[AP News](#), [AP News](#)].

Tyson Strategies LLC

- **Gobeil used for legal consulting:** Gobeil’s June 2019 campaign filing listed \$2,000 paid to Tyson Strategies LLC for “Political Law Consulting” [[Georgia Ethics Commission](#), candidate search].
- **Principal represented Trump in GA after 2020 election:** The Atlanta Journal-Constitution reported in November 2020 that Bryan Tyson, the firm’s principal/operator [[Tyson Strategies](#)], was one of the lawyers who represented both the Trump campaign and Georgia Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger [The Atlanta Journal-Constitution, 11/14/2020] as Trump was attacking Georgia’s election results.

Endorsements

No endorsements were listed online.

Campaign finance

Gobeil has a reported \$392,554.57 ending monetary balance as of January 2026 reporting [[Georgia State Ethics Commission](#) candidate search]. She has received 682 total campaign contributions since her first campaign filing in 2019. Of those contributions, there are some notable:

1. **Marty Daniel (Daniel Defense):** Daniel Defense has been a focal point of public controversy after a Daniel Defense rifle was used in the 2022 Uvalde school shooting; reporting also describes lawsuits alleging the company's marketing practices contributed to harms, which the company disputes. Listed as a \$5,000 itemized contribution with employer "Daniel Defense" [[WTOC](#)].
2. **Tye Darland (Koch Capabilities / Georgia-Pacific):** Darland is a senior Koch/Georgia-Pacific legal executive and (importantly for "connections") he is identified by Gov. Kemp's office as a [member of Georgia's Judicial Nominating Commission](#) (although not nominated until 2024). Listed as an itemized \$1,000 contribution with employer "Koch Capabilities."
3. **Georgia Lawsuit Reform PAC — tort reform / anti-trial lawyer politics:** his PAC is part of the organized "lawsuit reform / tort reform" ecosystem (their own site has a donation page for the "[Georgia Lawsuit Reform PAC](#)" and frames the mission as fighting "lawsuit abuse"). Georgia tort reform (SB 68 / SB 69) has been a high-conflict political fight, with supporters arguing it reduces "frivolous" suits/insurance costs and critics arguing it limits access to justice (including for victims of violence) [[AP](#)]. Public campaign-finance aggregators show the PAC receiving sizable corporate/insurance contributions (e.g., entries listing Koch, insurers, etc.) and making payments to GOP-aligned committees/candidates [[Transparency USA](#)].
4. **Thompson Hine LLC:** The firm where Gobeil was formerly a partner contributed \$2,500 to her campaign in 2019.

While it was not initially evident any individuals who contributed to Gobeil's campaign litigated in her courtroom, there were multiple contributors who worked at firms that did litigate on cases Gobeil ruled on as a judge or other contributors that may spark controversy or conflicts of interest. It should be noted, since there were over 600 contributions to Gobeil's campaign, a comprehensive check on all contributors, firms, and PACs was not possible.

1. **Drew Eckl & Farnham (donor: John G. Blackmon):** Partnership-fee dispute case involving Drew Eckl & Farnham heard by a panel including Gobeil [[Justia](#)]. Blackmon donated \$250 to Gobeil's campaign in 2025.
2. **Bloom Parham LLP (donor: Simon Bloom / firm):** Rivers v. Rivers (2019) lists Bloom Parham attorneys as counsel and is authored by Gobeil [[Leagle](#)]. Simon Bloom and Bloom Parham have donated collectively \$1,750 to Gobeil.
3. **Kilpatrick Townsend & Stockton (multiple donors):** Cardea Corporate Holdings v. LaRocco (2024) is authored by Gobeil, Judge and lists Kilpatrick as counsel [[Leagle](#)]. Contributions from the firm's employees total \$2,100.
4. **Morgan & Morgan (multiple donors):** Woods v. Heath (2024) is authored by Gobeil, Judge and lists Morgan & Morgan as counsel [[Leagle](#)]. Contributions from the firm's employees total \$2,750.
5. **Slappey & Sadd (firm donor):** Also appears as counsel in Woods v. Heath (2024) (Gobeil-authored) [[Leagle](#)]. Contributions from the firm total \$3,000.
6. **Balch & Bingham (multiple donors):** UHS of Anchor v. GA Dept. of Community Health (2021) lists Balch & Bingham attorneys as counsel; panel includes Gobeil [[Caselaw](#)]. Contributions from the firm's employees total \$10,556.03.

7. **Leonard Leo:** Nationally prominent conservative legal-movement donor/strategist; watchdog and media reporting describe scrutiny and allegations about nonprofit money flowing to firms tied to him (he denies wrongdoing) [[The Guardian](#)]. Leo gave \$1,000 to Gobeil’s campaign.
8. **Joel Velasco (UnitedHealth Group):** Senior VP at UnitedHealth Group (international/Latin America); more “salience” than scandal—UHG is heavily regulated and politically active [[Wilson Center](#)]. Velasco contributed \$250.00 to Gobeil’s campaign.
9. **HR Policy Association (now “CHRO Association”) (Elizabeth Anderson donor):** Employer association active in federal policy debates; example: asked DOL to pause overtime rule implementation amid litigation [[CHRO](#)]. Anderson donated \$1,000 to Gobeil’s campaign.
10. **Huntermaclean Georgia PAC:** Committee for firm located in Savannah. Is publicly listed in campaign-finance aggregators; useful for mapping institutional donor networks [[Hunter Maclean](#), [Transparency USA](#)]. The firm/firm’s PAC donated \$2,000 to Gobeil while several of the firm’s employees also contributed \$800.
11. **Georgia Bankers Association PAC:** Federally registered trade association PAC [[FEC](#)]. The PAC contributed \$1,000 to Gobeil’s campaign.
12. **Alliance for Automotive Innovation (industry lobby group) (donor Don Stewart):** Major auto industry trade association; takes positions on emissions/fuel economy and regulatory authority [[Wikipedia](#)]. Stewart contributed \$250 to Gobeil’s campaign.

AFFIRMED ELECTION RESULTS MUST BE CERTIFIED

The Georgia Court of Appeals ruled that certifying election results in Georgia is a mandatory duty for local election officials and cannot be refused at their discretion.

The case involved Julie Adams, a Republican member of the Fulton County Board of Elections who refused to certify the results of the 2024 presidential primary, arguing she had the legal authority to withhold certification.

In a July 2 decision, appellate judges Elizabeth Gobeil and Brian Rickman upheld a lower-court ruling by Robert McBurney that election certification is not discretionary. The court said local election superintendents may review election materials and report concerns about possible fraud or errors, but those concerns do not give them authority to refuse certification of results.

The ruling came amid broader legal disputes over election administration in Georgia. Around the same time, the Supreme Court of Georgia struck down several controversial election rules adopted by the Republican-controlled Georgia State Election Board, finding the board exceeded its constitutional authority. Civil rights and voting groups had opposed the rules, arguing they could create confusion in elections, while supporters said the changes were intended to rebuild confidence in the state's election system after disputes over the 2020 election [Franklin County Citizen, 7/10/2025].

RULED KEMP DOES NOT HAVE TO INVESTIGATE R BOARD OF ELECTIONS MEMBERS

The Georgia Court of Appeals upheld the dismissal of a lawsuit that sought to force Brian Kemp to hold a hearing on ethics allegations against three Republican members of the Georgia State Election Board.

The lawsuit was filed by Democratic state senators Nabilah Islam Parkes and Randal Mangham along with former Fulton County elections chair Cathy Woolard. They argued that letters they sent to Kemp in August 2024 accusing election board members Janice Johnston, Janelle King, and Rick Jeffares of ethics violations should have triggered a formal investigation and hearing.

The appellate court ruled that Kemp was not legally required to act because Georgia law only mandates such hearings when "formal charges" are filed by an official investigative body, not when allegations are submitted through letters by individuals acting as private citizens. The court emphasized that the plaintiffs did not demonstrate any authority that allowed them to bring formal charges beyond what any member of the public could do.

The ruling affirmed an earlier decision by Ural Glanville dismissing the case. The lawsuit had stemmed from disputes over controversial election rule changes adopted by the State Election Board before the

2024 election, including proposals for hand-counting ballots and allowing election officials to delay certification while investigating irregularities.

A panel consisting of Judges Jeffrey Davis, Sara L. Doyle, and Elizabeth Gobeil issued the decision [Law360 Legal News, 9/23/2025].

REVIVED 2020 ELECTION DENIER CASE

The Georgia Court of Appeals partially revived a lawsuit alleging vote dilution in Fulton County, Georgia related to claims that counterfeit ballots were counted in the 2020 general election.

In a unanimous decision written by Presiding Judge Christopher J. McFadden and joined by Judges Elizabeth Gobeil and Benjamin A. Land, the court ruled that a trial court had wrongly dismissed claims brought by four Fulton County voters on the grounds that they lacked standing. The appellate court said the lower court must reconsider whether those voters can proceed with their claims in light of a new standing standard set by the Supreme Court of Georgia in the case *Sons of Confederate Veterans v. Henry County Board of Commissioners*.

That precedent clarified that plaintiffs may establish standing as “community stakeholders,” meaning that even generalized grievances shared by members of a community—such as voters—can sometimes qualify as an injury.

However, the appellate court upheld the dismissal of claims by five voters who lived outside Fulton County, ruling they lacked standing because they were not residents, citizens, or taxpayers of the county and therefore could not claim to be community stakeholders there.

The decision sends the case back to the trial court to reconsider the standing of the Fulton County voters but leaves intact the dismissal of other claims, including allegations that the county violated the Georgia Open Records Act [Law360 Legal News, 5/11/2023].

PROTECTIONS FROM PREDATORY BUSINESSES

RULED AGAINST COUNTY PENSIONERS

The Georgia Court of Appeals ruled 2–1 against a group of roughly 100 current and former Hall County, Georgia employees who claimed the county unlawfully froze their pension benefits in 1998.

The lawsuit—seeking about \$75 million—argued that when the county switched from a defined benefit pension plan to a defined contribution plan, freezing benefits under the older plan effectively terminated the plan, which should have required notice and a hearing for employees.

In the majority opinion written by Benjamin A. Land and joined by Elizabeth Gobeil, the court upheld summary judgment for the county. The judges ruled that:

The notice-and-hearing requirement was not part of the pension plan before the 1998 freeze, and

The freeze did not legally terminate the plan, since accrued benefits were still maintained and administered for employees even though new contributions stopped.

Presiding Judge Christopher J. McFadden dissented, arguing that stopping contributions and freezing benefit accruals effectively amounted to a partial termination of the pension plan, which should have triggered notice and hearing protections.

Attorneys for the employees said they plan to appeal to the Supreme Court of Georgia, arguing the majority misinterpreted the law and facts [The Times, Gainesville, Ga., 3/16/2023].

PROTECTING BIG PHARMA

A panel of the Georgia Court of Appeals reversed a trial court and ruled that a lawsuit against McKesson Corporation over a man's opioid overdose death was filed too late because the wrong statute of limitations had been applied.

The plaintiffs, Angel and Christopher Bolton, sued McKesson under Georgia's Drug Dealer Liability Act (DDLA), seeking damages related to the overdose death of their father, Kevin Bolton. A lower court had allowed the case to proceed using a 20-year statute of limitations, which applies in certain specialized legal circumstances.

However, the appellate panel—composed of Judges Jeffrey Davis, Brian Rickman, and Elizabeth Gobeil—unanimously held that the trial court applied the wrong standard. Writing for the court, Davis explained that courts must determine the applicable statute of limitations based on the nature of the injury being claimed, not the statute used to assert liability. Because the Boltons were seeking damages for personal injuries stemming from their father's death, the claim fell under Georgia's two-year statute of limitations for personal injury and wrongful death claims.

Kevin Bolton died on February 21, 2016, after allegedly receiving high doses of prescription opioids—including hydrocodone and oxycodone—from a Savannah-area doctor later convicted of running a pill mill. Although the physician prescribed the drugs, the Boltons argued that McKesson and other pharmaceutical industry actors could also be liable under the DDLA.

The Court of Appeals ruled that the claim accrued at the time of Bolton's death and that the Boltons did not add McKesson as a defendant until April 5, 2018—several weeks beyond the two-year deadline—making the claim time-barred.

Because the court resolved the case on procedural grounds, it did not address the broader legal question of whether a licensed pharmaceutical distributor like McKesson can be held liable under the Drug Dealer Liability Act [Law360 Legal News, 2/12/2026].

RULED IN FAVOR OF AMBULANCE CHASING

The Georgia Court of Appeals dismissed a lawsuit filed by Georgia personal injury lawyer R. Shane Lazenby against competing attorney Glenn Cambre and his firm, Cambre & Associates, over alleged improper solicitation of car-crash victims.

Lazenby claimed Cambre engaged in "ambulance chasing" by obtaining accident victims' identities

before they became public and contacting them immediately with aggressive pitches to hire the firm. According to the complaint, the firm sometimes sent a “runner” (a paralegal) directly to victims’ homes with representation contracts. Lazenby sought to bring a class action on behalf of other plaintiff attorneys, arguing that Cambre’s alleged conduct violated Georgia’s anti-solicitation laws and interfered with lawyers’ ability to compete fairly.

The Court of Appeals, in an opinion written by Judge Elizabeth Gobeil, ruled that Lazenby failed to state a valid legal claim. While Georgia law recognizes a property interest in a lawyer’s existing business and client contracts, the court found that Lazenby did not allege interference with any specific client contract or his license to practice law, which would be required to support such a claim.

The court also rejected Lazenby’s argument that plaintiff lawyers were the primary victims of the alleged scheme. Instead, Gobeil wrote that the people directly harmed—if the allegations were true—would be the accident victims whose personal data may have been improperly obtained, not competing attorneys. The court therefore dismissed both the underlying claims and related racketeering allegations [Legal Newline, 11/6/2025].
