

PUEBLO COUNTY CLERK & RECORDER CANDIDATE MARY VIETH (R)

Mary Vieth is a Republican running for Pueblo County Clerk and Recorder in 2026. Vieth has not previously sought elected office. She is the only Republican candidate on the primary ballot and will face incumbent Democratic Recorder Candace Rivera in the November general election. According to a June 2026 article in the Pueblo Chieftan, she's running "to increase accountability, leadership, and integrity in the office," stating that "my campaign mission is to improve customer service, secure transparent elections, increase community transparency, support employees and efficient operations, and increase accessibility for all residents." Donald [Trump defeated](#) Kamala Harris in Pueblo County in 2024 by an approximate result of 43,736 to 39,351.

Key Findings:

Vieth declared bankruptcy twice, in 2007 and 2011. In March 2007, Mary Frances Vieth and her then-husband Peter Vieth filed a voluntary petition for Chapter 7 Bankruptcy in U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of Colorado. The couple's assets totaled fewer than \$16,000 against more than \$330,000 in overall liabilities. The bankruptcy was closed in September 2007 following a trustee's report certifying the estate had been fully administered. Just over four years later, Mary Vieth filed a voluntary petition for Chapter 13 bankruptcy, again in Colorado. The October 2011 petition listed Mary Vieth alone; it is unclear if she and Peter were still married. Vieth declared more than \$15,000 in debts and expenses in her 2011 petition. She was discharged from that bankruptcy in March 2015, after repaying her debts.

Vieth is a political newcomer who is promising to "restore trust, transparency, and professionalism to the Pueblo County Clerk & Recorder's Office," and to ensure "our elections are secure, transparent, and trusted by everyone." Vieth announced her candidacy for Pueblo County Clerk and Recorder in February 2026 and will run unopposed in the GOP primary after she was the only candidate selected for the slate at the Pueblo County Republican Assembly in March. Vieth has not yet reported any fundraising activity; her first campaign finance reports are due in June. On her campaign website and Facebook page, she has announced a Campaign Kickoff Party scheduled for May 2, 2026.

Vieth is a Licensed Professional Nurse and has also worked in the aviation and education sectors. In a press release announcing her campaign, Vieth boasted a "diverse background in healthcare, aviation security, education, and customer service leadership." She is a member of the Pueblo member of the City of Pueblo Memorial Airport Advisory Committee for a term running from Sept. 30, 2025 to Sept. 30, 2028. Vieth has her nursing license from the state of Colorado, set to expire Aug. 31, 2026. Earlier in her career, Vieth worked in education services; according to court records from her 2007 bankruptcy, she worked at the time for a local school district.

March 2026: Vieth was the only candidate selected at the Pueblo County Republican Assembly to appear on the primary ballot for Clerk and Recorder. “Both parties kicked off their county assemblies Saturday morning and selected local office candidates for the primary ballot. Primaries will be held on June 30, 2026. Local candidates on the ballot chosen at the county assemblies included candidates for assessor, clerk and recorder, Pueblo County Commissioner District 3, coroner, sheriff, surveyor, treasurer, Colorado House District 46, and Colorado Senate District 3.... Who will be on the Republican ballot? ...
