

CLARK COUNTY COUNTY COMMISSION CANDIDATE DISTRICT F BECKY HARRIS (I)

Key Findings Include:

- **Harris Has Repositioned Herself Politically As An Independent Candidate After A Long Career In Republican Politics.** Harris served as a Republican state senator, contributed more than \$45,000 to Republican candidates and party organizations between 2012 and 2019, and publicly described herself as a Republican before changing her voter registration to nonpartisan in 2025.
- **Harris Maintained Close Ties To Nevada's Republican Political Establishment Prior To Launching Her County Commission Campaign.** Campaign finance records show contributions to Republican candidates including Carrie Buck, Erv Nelson, Scott Hammond, Heidi Seevers Gansert, the Clark County Republican Central Committee, and the Senate Republican Leadership Conference.
- **Harris Has A Documented Record Of Socially Conservative Positions On LGBTQ Issues.** In 2001, Harris testified on behalf of the Coalition for the Protection of Marriage in Nevada against legislation supported by same-sex couples seeking legal recognition and benefits. She also contributed \$3,000 to the organization supporting Nevada's constitutional same-sex marriage ban and later voted against legislation prohibiting conversion therapy for minors.
- **Harris Took Several Conservative Positions On Healthcare And Cannabis Policy While Serving In The Legislature.** Harris voted against a 2017 resolution urging Congress to preserve the Affordable Care Act and voted against legislation expanding access to medical marijuana and protections for medical marijuana patients and providers.
- **Harris' Legislative Record Included Support For Several Education, Healthcare, And Social-Service Measures That Crossed Traditional Partisan Lines.** While Harris took more conservative positions on issues including conversion therapy, the Affordable Care Act, and medical marijuana expansion, she also sponsored or co-sponsored legislation supporting multicultural education, need-based college financial aid, services for English-language learners, teacher recruitment and reimbursement, human-trafficking victims, mental health services, and streamlined access to physicians.
- **Harris' Legislative Record Was Primarily Focused On Education, Economic Development, And Regulatory Issues Rather Than Culture-War Politics.** As a senator, Harris sponsored legislation related to teacher recruitment, charter schools, education funding, healthcare access, business development, and tax incentives for data centers.
- **Gaming, Development, Construction, And Business Interests Represented A Significant Portion Of Harris' Early Fundraising Base.** Major contributors to her 2026 campaign included gaming companies, casino operators, developers, construction firms, attorneys, lobbyists, and business interests.

Jurisdiction Summary

Clark County is Nevada's largest county and a key battleground in statewide elections. While it remains the state's primary source of Democratic votes, recent elections have been increasingly competitive and characterized by split-ticket voting. At the local level, Clark County Commission races have generally favored Democrats, but several districts have been competitive. In 2020, Democrats won District A by about six points and District B by about eleven points, while the District C race was effectively tied before election officials declined to certify that contest because the margin was only 10 votes and there were more discrepancies than the margin. In the 2026 District F primary, Heidi Kasama won the Republican primary with 53.69%, while Minja Yan led a crowded Democratic primary with 37.85%, indicating active competition on both sides ahead of the general election. District F reflects those dynamics, with roughly 40% of voters registered as nonpartisan, compared to 28% Democratic and 26% Republican as of late 2025.

Clark County has also been a focal point of Nevada's election administration debates since 2020. Election-denial activists have repeatedly challenged election results and promoted fraud allegations centered on the county, though courts and election officials have consistently upheld the integrity of Nevada's election processes. There is no indication that Harris has centered her campaign on election-denial claims.

Harris Was Previously Registered As A Democrat. “A former Democrat. Interviews with Nevada political leaders and a search of public records suggest Harris doesn't have anything to hide. But her political story does have some twists. She was a registered Democrat in 2002, then switched her party affiliation to Republican two years later. Republican strategist Chuck Muth said the move from the left to the right shouldn't be the reason for the campaign's lack of transparency. ‘If that campaign can't handle the fact that she was a Democrat more than 10 years ago, they have no reason running a campaign,’ he said. Harris has lived in Nevada for 15 years. She ran for state Assembly District 21 last election cycle and lost by just 780 votes to Democrat Andy Eisen.
